Your request is referred to Powercor and other members of the service
without you needing to make extra phones calls. Powercor will respond within
two working days with plans and information about the location of
underground cables.

Once you have the necessary information to plan your work you need to be aware of the conditions for working in the vicinity of Powercor's underground cables. Following the attached conditions will reduce the risk of personal injury to contractors, the public and physical damage to the electricity assets.

It's in the interest of everyone that your projects are completed in a safe manner, which will contribute to the overall success of the project. Remember that it's your responsibility for health and safety and that safety should never be compromised to get the job done.
